The Idaho State Bowhunters Inc. is dedicated to promoting biologically-sound wildlife management; to keeping our members informed on matters that affect their hunting privileges; and to encourage the formation of new archery clubs who will lend strength to our goal of maintaining quality bow hunting in Idaho.

## PRESIDENT REPORT

On January 10, 24 ISB executive board members, club presidents and members met at the Idaho Fish and Game office in Jerome for the annual ISB winter general membership and board of directors' meeting.

Our guest speaker this year was Idaho Fish and Game Deputy Director Virgil Moore. Director Moore provided the group with a PowerPoint presentation supporting the proposed Idaho Fish and Game fee increase, followed by a lengthy question and answer session on several topics. The resulting vote to support the Idaho Fish and Game fee increase passed with one dissenting vote. Most present agreed that they would contact at least one legislator from their legislative district in support of the fee increase. Director Moore then stayed

through lunch to visit individually with several of the participants.

The ISB winter meeting is the date that ISB determines donation funding from our annual \$2,000 donation fund. The '09 donation funds went to Idaho Sportsmen's Caucus Advisory Council, Scooter's Youth Hunting Camp, Children's Archery Challenge and Hunt of a Lifetime at \$500 each. The board also approved an expenditure of \$5,000 from the general fund for additional targets, and to investigate the purchase of an additional trailer to cover our increasing needs.

The ISB Jamboree planning meeting will be Saturday, March 28, from 9-4 at the Jerome Fish and Game office. Any member is most welcome to attend and assist the executive board with this important planning

meeting. I need to receive any suggestions for agenda items by the first week of March.

Once again, I would like to remind everyone that this year we elect president, secretary, and big game chairman. Any member in good standing is eligible for these offices by submitting a letter of acceptance accompanied by the signature of five supporting members to the secretary before April 1, 2009, or by write in vote on the voting ballot at the Jamboree.

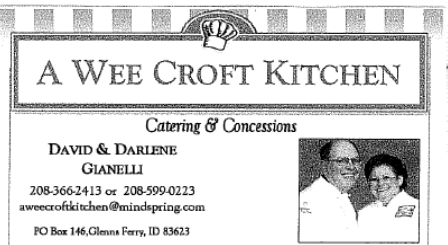

## REGION 6 REPORT

The winter meeting has come and gone, I thought it was quite interesting. Richard, I thought, did an excellent job of keeping everyone on track and not getting off target too often.

ISB, as a group, supported the Idaho Fish and Game's proposed fee hikes. There was a lot of discussion within the group, nobody is ever happy about cost increases but in the end almost everyone supported the fee hikes.

The point system for Bowhunter of the Year competition was updated, basically there are two species of deer in Idaho and three species of turkey and now you can count the first harvest of each species with any tag legally acquired (also non-resident tags purchased by residents) in Idaho. You can only count the 1<sup>st</sup> animal of each species you harvest in Idaho.

March 28 is the Jamboree planning meeting in Twin Falls. Also, ISB is looking to purchase another trailer to house and transport targets and other ISB properties. They have one trailer now and it's full. We decided to spend \$5000 on targets this year; my vote as always is for elk targets. I know they are one of the most expensive targets, but I don't go to Stanley Idaho each year to shoot skunks and rabbits, that's my opinion, not that it's worth much. I don't know if ISB owns skunks or rabbit targets, but you get my point. Or put them on the competition

ranges, they need the small vitals. Nothing like a 45 yard skunk shot to sort out the posers. As for the elk targets, I would be more than willing to use them at the region 6 shoot, which by the way is going to be at the Steel Creek campground in the Kilgore area. (About 70 miles north of Idaho Falls). I have the campground reserved from Thursday (2 p.m.) the 18<sup>th</sup> until Monday morning (11 a.m.) the 22<sup>nd</sup> of June. Bring your camping equipment and enjoy the weekend. It's a beautiful area that should make for an excellent shoot.

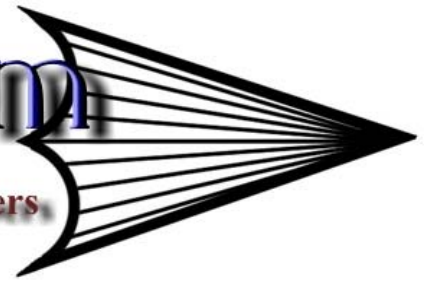

# RULES FOR ISB COMPETITIONS

## Big Game Award:

All ISB members are eligible to receive, without cost, awards for animals harvested, either in or out of state. You must submit, within 180 days of a kill, a report card to the Big Game Chairman. If you delay longer than 180 days or have lost an award and desire a replacement, you will be charged the price of that award which is \$2. If a report card is not available, send the following information to the Big Game Chairman: name, address, game harvested, where taken, sex of animal, date of kill, whether first kill of species and signature of person vouching for kill.

For first kill of species, you will receive an Idaho-shaped stick pin and patch depicting the animal taken. For all subsequent kills of species, you'll receive an arrow stick pin and patch depicting the animal.

"Big Game Awards" include: elk, moose, caribou, mule deer, whitetail deer, antelope, mountain goat, big horn sheep, bear, bobcat, lynx, cougar, coyote, fox, javelina, wild hog and turkey.

## Small Game Award:

All ISB members are eligible to receive an award at a cost of 50¢ each for the harvest of small game, either in or out of state. To receive these awards send the following information to the Big Game Chairman: name, address, species taken, where taken, date of kill, and signature of person who can vouch for the kill. Include 50¢ for each award.

For small game you will receive a patch depicting the animal harvested.

"Small Game Awards" include: goose, duck, badger, rock chuck, raccoon, weasel, pheasant, snowshoe, cottontail, jack rabbit, porcupine, skunk, grouse, sage hen, chukar, quail, dove, frog, gopher, ground squirrel, carp, sucker, mouse, pigeon, sparrow, starling and non-poisonous snake.

## Bowhunter of the Year Competition

### (Male and Female)

All ISB members are eligible for entry in the "Bowhunter of the Year" competition. Only animals harvested in Idaho may be entered and a report card must be submitted to the Big Game Chairman within 180 days of the kill. All entries must be submitted on or before April 30 of the following year.

The Bowhunter of the Year competition is run on a points system, and the man and woman, youth boy and youth girl, with the greatest accumulation of points at the end of the year takes the honors.

If your animal qualifies for Pope & Young, and you send in a photocopy of the final score sheet, you will receive bonus points in the amount of ½ value of male animal.

Any animal harvested legally and within the rules of fair chase are eligible for entry in the Bowhunter of the Year Competition. However, if you harvest multiple animals of the same species in the same year, you only receive points for the **FIRST** animal killed, even if the second animal is larger.

Small game also count towards Bowhunter of the Year. One point is allowed for each species of small game taken.


The animal point values are as follows:

## Best of Species

All ISB members are eligible to enter their harvests in the "Best of Species" competition. Only animals harvested in Idaho may be entered. Only species recognized as scorable by the Pope & Young club are eligible. A report card must be submitted to the Big Game Chairman accompanied by a copy of a completed Pope & Young score form for each entry. A 60-day drying period from date of kill is required for measurements to be valid. Therefore, those taking bear in the spring season will enter the next year's competition. Report cards must be submitted within 180 days of kill date. Animals being entered in Best of Species competition must meet ISB minimum score for that species.

All entries must be submitted on or before April 30 of the following year.

**BIG GAME CHAIRMAN**

As I sit down to write this article, I notice the thermometer which indicates that it is 3 degrees outside, reminding me that winter still has a firm grip on things around my stomping grounds. I'm starting to day-dream about

fishing (that doesn't require drilling a hole), outdoor shoots and other spring time activities. I guess all I can do is hurry up and wait! Spring will be here soon enough.

A couple of weeks ago, we held our winter general membership meeting in Twin Falls. One of the subjects of discussion was whether or not to allow animals harvested using non-resident tags (by resident members) to be eligible for entry in the Bowhunter of the Year and Best of Species competitions. It was the majority consensus that any animal that was taken legally and under fair chase in the state of Idaho (as long as it is the first animal of that particular species harvested in that season) should be eligible for entry in these competitions.

The fact that there are three different species of turkey in Idaho was also acknowledged. It was decided that each species should be counted separately when entered in the Bowhunter of the Year competition.

I am providing a revised version of the big and small game award rules with these changes and clarifications in this newsletter.

As of this writing, I have not yet received any entries for Best of Species for mule deer, whitetail deer, cougar, bear, mountain goat or bighorn sheep. So, if anyone has harvested an animal they would like to enter, please do so. Just send me a copy of the official Pope & Young score sheet along with a harvest report that is available in the newsletter or on-line. You have through April 30 to get these entries to me. The winners get a good looking jacket.

Spring turkey and bear seasons are just around the corner and I'd like to wish everyone the best of luck in those upcoming seasons.
